Exercise 1

Can you match the countries in the box with the twelve descriptions below? (Note that four of the countries in the box are not described.)

1. It is the second most populous country in the world. Its population is smaller than China's but more than three times bigger than that of the United States.
2. Its athletes won the highest number of gold medals at the 2008 Olympic Games.
3. It contains the only city in the world that is built on two different continents. (The city is not the country's capital, but receives more foreign tourists than the capital.) The country's flag is mostly red, and so are the shirts of its national football team.
4. As well as having many species of animal that do not live anywhere else in the world, this large country in the southern hemisphere has quite a lot of dangerous animals, including crocodiles, sharks, and poisonous snakes and spiders.

8. This is a hot, dry country with lots of desert. It has the world's tallest building, officially opened in January 2010.
9. This country is not small (it is larger than Britain or Italy, for example) but it has fewer than 5 million people. Although English is not the first language, most people here speak it very well.
10. This country is in the south of the world's second largest continent. It became independent in 1975 and its official language is Portuguese.
11. This country consists of fifty states. The largest, whose name begins with 'A', does not have a border with any of the other 49.
12. It is the world's ninth largest country, in the world's largest continent. It has borders with five other countries, including Russia and China.

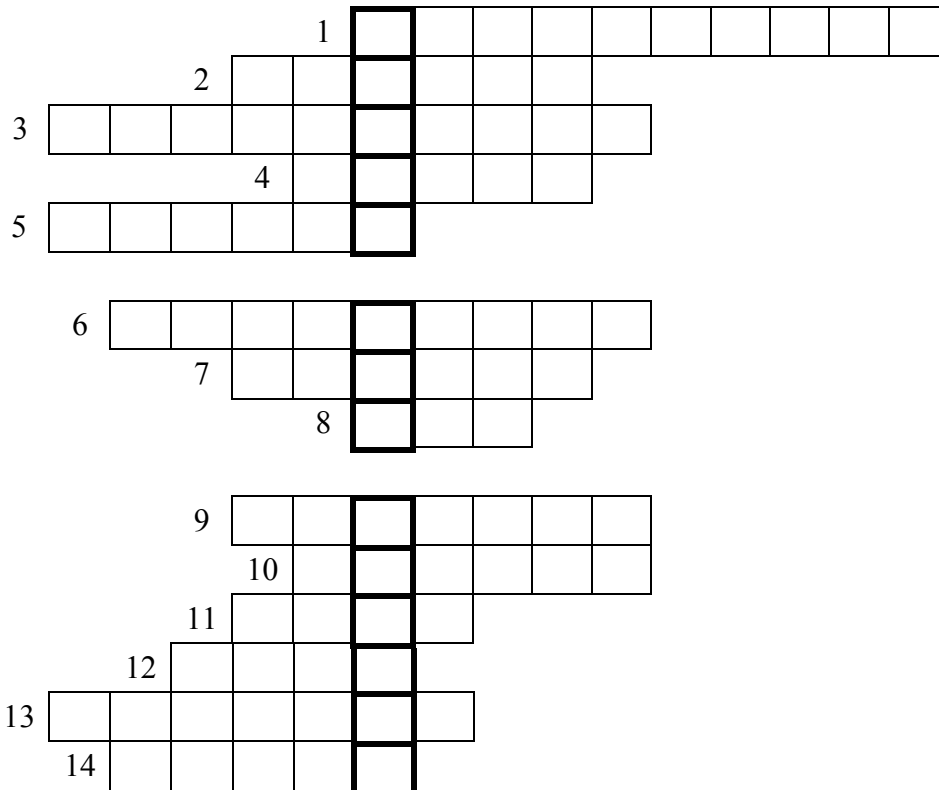
