

Aim

To make an oral presentation and poster to attract EISTI students to one of our partner institutions abroad.

Tasks

- A) **Research:** Look on AREL (Espace International) to find out where we have partnerships with foreign universities. Choose ONE institution.
- Find out about the **courses of study or work placements** they offer for EISTI students, the entrance requirements, general information about the institution (such as age, size, student population, facilities, student support, career prospects etc).
 - Also, find out **general information about the country** that would be helpful to know if you were considering working or studying there (such as languages spoken, visa requirements, cultural differences, climate, food, lifestyle, things to do, places to see...etc.).
- B) **Presentation:** Work in groups of **3-4 students**. Make a presentation to attract EISTI students to your chosen institution and country. NB: Each group must choose an institution from a different country, so please indicate your choice on the shared document in the drive. **Use visual aids.** Your presentation must last **15-20 minutes (5 mins per person)** and should include all the information described in the Research task above. You may organize your presentation in any way you like, but you must share speaking time equally between participants. **The presentations will take place on 6th and 13th June.**
- C) **Poster:** Each group must design a poster to attract EISTI students to their chosen institution. Your poster must be **A3 size, pdf** and must include at least **50 words in English**. The finished posters will be displayed in the language classrooms. **Please send your poster to your teacher by 16th May to allow time for correction and printing.**

Assessment

A) Task management and poster (5 points)

Each group will be awarded a mark out of 5 for their handling of the three tasks, ie, their ability to follow the instructions given and complete the tasks within the given time frame.

B) Presentation (15 points)

Students will be given an individual mark based on the following criteria:

Content: Is there evidence of research on your chosen institution and country? Do you include all the information required? Do you present the information in a clear, interesting and attractive way?

Language: Do you demonstrate a wide range of vocabulary specific to the topic? Is your grammar accurate? Do you speak fluently with correct pronunciation?

Delivery: Do you communicate effectively with the audience? (Ie, Do you use eye-contact? Do you vary your pace and intonation? Do you demonstrate enthusiasm? Do you use your visual aids effectively?)

The combination of your task management and poster and presentation marks will provide your prepared speaking assessment mark for the semester.
