RAPPEL GRAMMATICAL

In et into

Les prépositions ne sont pas toujours faciles à utiliser. Elles introduisent soit un nom, soit un gérontif. **In et into** se traduisent par « dans ». Mais en anglais, **in** est utilisé quand on situe quelqueun ou quelque chose. **Into** est utilisé quand on indique l'entrée dans un lieu.

Par exemple : • **They loved living in the city of Pretoria.**

• **They walked into the museum together.**

At et to

At et **to** se traduisent par « à » mais **at** signifie qu'il n'y a pas de mouvement et **to** exprime une direction.

Par exemple : • **I'm already at the airport.**

• **My family is on way to the airport now.**
