

ING2 SEMESTER 2 ORAL ASSESSMENT 2 GROUP PRESENTATIONS

For your oral assessment for semester 2, you are required to **make a presentation** and **lead a discussion** related to the second theme of the semester: **GLOBAL ISSUES**.

Objectives

The aim of each group's presentation is to **make other members of the class aware of a global issue** and to **express a personal opinion** about it.

Furthermore, in order to **maximize class attentiveness and participation**, each group must produce a set of questions for use during and after the presentation. These questions should include **at least 3 comprehension questions** about the presentation itself as well as **at least 3 questions or comments to discuss** in class after the presentation.

The use of slides during the presentation is recommended.

Each group must choose a different issue to present. Sign up on the Google document to indicate your chosen subject by 17th February, 18h.

Organization

Form 7 groups (6 groups of 2, 1 group of 3)

Each presentation should last **10-15 minutes**, depending on the size of the group. Following each presentation there will be a **10-minute class discussion** based on your prepared questions (use slides).

Assessment

Students will be awarded **an individual mark** for their participation during the presentations, according to the following criteria:

- **Content:** Is the presentation interesting and informative? Is there evidence of research? (5 points)
- **Language:** accurate use of grammar and vocabulary, range of structures and expressions, fluency, pronunciation (5 points)
- **Delivery:** Are the visual aids clear? (**NB: although students may refer to brief notes or visual aids, they should not simply read their presentation from the notes or slides!**) Does the presenter speak clearly, with an appropriate volume level and with varied intonation? Does (s)he look up, smile and engage the audience? (5 points)
- **Interaction:** Do you initiate, develop, and facilitate the follow-up discussion with the entire class? (5 points)

Dates

The presentations will take place on the **2nd and 16th March**.
